

Volunteer Litter Picking Risk Assessment

This Risk Assessment covers the hazards associated with volunteers' litter picking in the parish of Boyatt Wood Activities that do not follow these guidelines are carried out at your own risk.

There will be a short safety briefing at the commencement of the litter pick and adult volunteers will be provided with protective equipment.

Volunteers are responsible for their own wellbeing, and expected to wear appropriate clothing, recommend long sleeved tops and long trousers, with sturdy footwear, hat if required. If you suffer from any medical condition or allergises, carry your own medication.
