PA/003/24 Chairs Annual Report

The Chair advised that the council has a suite of policies, the basis for council operations including, finance, staff and councillors conduct, allotments etc. The Council has undertaken the Civility and Respect Pledge seeking to address the misunderstandings within the local government sector. Implemented a bespoke council accountancy package, producing monthly financial reports. BWPC is working with Eastleigh Borough Council to take over the management of St Catherines Road allotment garden site. Also agreed to deploy speed indicators in four locations in the parish. The findings and reports are shared with Council.

Have also hosted community events such as Eastleigh Pride, Litter Pick and Coronation. Community Events will be an ongoing venture to celebrate the community and special occasions.

PA/004/24 <u>Grants awarded.</u>

Victim Support – Received a donation of £100.00 to purchase security items so residents can feel safer in their homes. Anyone affected by crime or



traumatic events can access their services. Last year Victim Support supported approximately 184 Boyatt Wood residents.

PA/005/24 Results of Community Survey

Chair thanked all for their participation in the Community Survey. It was open for 16 weeks, circulated to each household, social media, online, and at events. 29 Questions is total relating to persons, community issues, views of council and possible improvements to Boyatt Wood area.

The majority of responses received from persons aged 35-74 Key points

<u>Dislikes</u> – Parking and speeding issues, litter/flytipping, condition of footpaths and street lighting

<u>Likes</u> – Area feels safe, would like to see more events/activities for elderly and lonely. More events/activities for all ages. Better recycling facilities.

The responses will form the basis of the Council Vision/Business Plan

PC Scott Graham is a member of the Eastleigh Central Neighbourhood Policing Team.
